Catholic Sacraments: A contemporary View in Light of the Protestant Reformation, presented by parishioner Bob O’Gorman, PhD

Jan. 7 — *Catholic Imagination*

In Christ the King’s series on the Protestant Reformation during Oct. and Nov., two major differences between the Catholic and the Protestant approaches to Christianity were highlighted: (1) the emphasis on word/Bible over imagination/Sacraments (Protestant *verbal literacy* versus Catholic *image literary*) and (2) the Protestant emphasis on lay control (*priesthood of all*) versus Catholic ordained *hierarchical* control, especially over the sacraments. These two presentations take a look at developments animating Vatican II to engage those major issues which continue between Protestants and Catholics.
