WORD *on* FAITH

When I first conceived of this blurb, I planned to contrast **receiving** with taking communion. I wanted to suggest that receiving implied an attitude of acceptance, an openness to the joys and sorrows of life. **Taking**, on the other hand, connoted asserting one's own will. Yet it came to me that before I could receive communion I had to make a decision, stand up, step out, walk forward. Going to communion is not an either/or situation—receiving and taking are intertwined.

To delve a bit deeper into metaphor, a certain amount of receiving is necessary in life. We are dealt certain cards that we have to accept. How we play those cards makes a difference. We make decisions, take actions that mark our lives, the lives of others, the world around us. Our receiving a gift entails taking responsibility for that gift.

Too often I have bemoaned circumstances in my life without taking it upon myself to respond. I talk about the evil of prejudice but do nothing about it. I say I don't want to live in fear but refuse to face and overcome my fears. The Gospel invites me to live in communion. The church ritualized that action by standing up, stepping out, leaving the comfort of the pew and walking forward to receive the body of Christ. If I do, I take that body out into the world. We are called to take and to receive. Responding to that call entails receiving grace and taking grace with us out the door, becoming grace incarnate on this good earth.
