WORD *on* FAITH

Indentured servitude is illegal in India, but still practiced. Typically a family borrows a small amount of money from a loan shark in exchange for a member of the family working for him until the debt is paid. However, the rate of interest is so high that the principle is never paid back; indentured servitude is a lifetime of slavery.

The International Justice Mission has confronted this situation, including at times by connecting American lawyers to translators so that they could interview indentured servants and provide evidence of this illegal activity to the police. Drawing attention in India to the situation has proven to be successful, and indentured servitude has declined. But that is not the story I wish to tell.

I want you to imagine my husband trying to get evidence from an indentured woman who repeatedly asked him to pay back the principal she felt she owed. Drew explained to her that the loan was illegal, and, using any reasonable rate of interest, she had already paid back what she owed. To return the principle at this point would free her, but would ensure that the owner quickly use the money to enslave another. Eventually she relented and gave a statement that was taken to the police and eventually to court.

The story I wish I could tell is the effect this woman had on my husband. He saw in her an integrity, a commitment to keeping her word, that amazed him. He returned to the United States with a new perspective, a changed man who has continued to work for people on the margins. So I ask you, did Drew help save her or did she save Drew?
