WORD *on* FAITH

While sipping tea in the morning, I check a “Today in History” website to see what events happened in the past. That is how I learned that a Catholic priest, George Lemaitre, was the first to propose the Big Bang theory. I interpreted this fact as proof that science and religion do not need to be seen as being in tension with one another. I felt a surge of happiness akin to my soccer team scoring a goal — contextualist 1, Fundamentalist 0.

Our tradition upholds a contextual approach to Scripture, so I grew up considering history, literary convention, metaphor as necessary aspects of exegesis. I am aware that some other Christians take a more literal approach to interpreting Scripture and thus can experience scientific theories, such as the Big Bang, as threatening to faith. Having experienced how disconcerting it can be to have my worldview challenged, I try to draw on that memory in order to generate compassion for Christians who want me to believe God created the world in seven, well actually six, days.

Even more worrisome than this divide between contextualist and fundamentalist is my belief that conversations between people who see the world from different perspectives are occurring less and less frequently. Generally, the people I converse with tend to share my worldview. Perhaps I need to draw closer to people who do not think as I do so that the space between us does not continue to expand—for as the universe expands, it grows colder.
